BOND PROPOSAL AIMS TO UPGRADE SAFETY; BUILD ARTS AND COMMUNITY FITNESS CENTERS

Over the years, many things have changed in our community, but one thing has always remained true: Kingsley is the best place for our kids to go to school and for folks to raise their families.

This May, we're asking you to decide on a district bond proposal. We're doing this now because we have several areas that are in critical need of facility upgrades, and this proposal would allow us to build new spaces for academics, the arts, and athletics.

Additionally, it would allow us to fortify our buildings with safety upgrades. Currently, each building has a buzz-in system and our proposal would add security vestibules to each school building.

Our current buzz-in system allows anyone admitted to travel anywhere in our buildings,

BOX HOLDER KINGSLEY MI 49649 **leaving our staff and students vulnerable to safety threats.** The proposed vestibules add an additional layer of security and give the front office staff and our school resource officer direct sightlines to the front doors.

Further, this bond would allow us to address several ongoing issues:

- Elementary teachers and students are doing classroom interventions and one-on-one work inside custodial rooms and closets.
- Preschool classes are housed inside a portable building that has surpassed its lifespan.
- Arts and Athletics are competing for limited gym time, while our musicians and artists lack a dedicated performance area.

May 6, 2025 Bond Proposal Information Safety. Community. Opportunity.

Our community will have the opportunity to vote on a Kingsley Area Schools bond proposal on the May 6, 2025 election ballot. If approved, it would provide \$39,200,000 for building & site improvements to address identified and ongoing facility needs based on completed assessments and community input. If approved by voters, the 2025 bond millage is expected to result in a net increase of 4.90 mills from the current rate.

Why a Bond Proposal Now?

If approved by voters, the 2025 bond proposal would address the currently identified issues such as **critical infrastructure issues**, **and build new spaces for academics, athletics, and the arts.** Upgraded facilities would provide for student and **community access** to new, state-of-the-art facilities like gymnasiums and fitness centers. This bond proposal would also **improve security** infrastructure, including **modern security measures**, such as secure vestibules and updated access systems.

How much will this bond cost?

Kingsley Area Schools currently levies 0 mills. If the 2025 bond proposal is approved by voters, the net debt tax rate is expected to increase by 4.90 mills from current levels with an average millage rate of 4.07 throughout the life of the bond. The debt payoff for this bond is expected to be less than 30 years.



What projects are included in this bond proposal?

If the bond proposal is approved by voters, the existing Elementary School will become the new Lower Elementary for grades Pre-K-2. In addition, the existing Middle School will become the new Upper Elementary for grades 3-5. A new Middle School addition will be added to the High School, creating one unified campus.

How were the bond projects identified?

The school district completed an **internal review** of all school facilities as part of the school district's facility planning process.

After the internal review, school officials worked with architectural and construction management specialists to **finalize the list** of bond proposal projects to be addressed.

Several community meetings were held as well as a community survey to address concerns.

Due to the age of school facilities, the cost of the initial project list totaled over \$51 million.

The project list was narrowed down to first address priority needs such as facility upgrades, safety, and security. The board is dedicated to HVAC and roof infrastructure issues without bond proposal dollars.


I've heard space is an issue. Why can't you kick out the out-ofdistrict kids to make room?

Kingsley has a net population of 319 out-of-district students who collectively bring in a little more than \$3 million to the district. That money is critical to mechanical and infrastructure maintenance, including paying to repair the HVAC systems and put new roofs on our buildings.

If out of district kids were eliminated, the district would have to restructure classes and make staffing cuts which could risk eliminating electives.







"Butterfly" Trauma-Informed Training

Kingsley Elementary administrators and counselors recently graduated from Butterfly Action Team training with the St Clair Butterfly Foundation. They are now even more equipped to help students impacted by trauma feel safe, valued, and empowered at school. They learned neuroscience-based strategies to help students regulate emotions, rewire stress responses, and build resilience through creativity.





Students Journey to America on Ellis Island Day

In this extensive simulation, students, dressed as travelers from the 1900s, carried babies and luggage as they passed through checkpoints, health screenings, customs, and various obstacles in hopes of coming to America. 










Four Year Olds will Apply for GSRP: Free State Funded Preschool

To apply for a GSRP slot parents will need to email Kristin Goethals at kgoethals@kingsleyschools.org or go to NMCAA.net to set up an appointment and indicate Kingsley Preschool Program as their first choice of schools. The appointments are done in collaboration with NMCAA for Kingsley GSRP and Hannah Headstart slots. The GSRP slots are for students who are four years old by September 1* 2025. GSRP slots will first be offered to qualifying at risk families based on a series of risk factors including low family income and then to other families. Families qualifying for GSRP after their appointment will be asked to designate a first choice and second choice of program locations. Students may also be offered a Hannah Headstart slot if they qualify. The state qualifies students through June and acceptance letters are mailed at that time. Hours of operation are 8:30-3:15 Monday through Thursday. ALL students who will be 4 need to complete this application due to the state language around universal preschool.

Three Year Olds will Apply for Tuition Preschool

The tuition-based program is open to any family whose child is 30 months of age up to school age, and is potty trained, and will first be filled with three-year-olds. There are no income qualifiers to be accepted into the program, and the cost is \$36 per day (for the 2025-26 year, subject to change). The \$36 per day includes lunch, a morning snack, and an afternoon snack. Program options include Tuesday/Thursday, Monday/Wednesday/Friday, or Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday/Friday. Space is limited. If three-year-olds don't fill all the spaces we will fill in with four-year-olds. Filling out a preregistration form does NOT guarantee enrollment. Letters will be mailed in May verifying acceptance. Hours of operation are 7:45 am to 3:45 pm. Return form to:
